Online tools: REC is ramping up resources and solutions to meet the growing demand for EV charging. We have tools on our website to help you learn about electric vehicles (EV), compare an EV to your current vehicle, and to assess the various models on the market.

Charging Incentives: Through a pilot program over the past year, 200 REC members who drive all-electric or select hybrid vehicles qualified for a \$7 bill credit each month, which is the same as 200 miles of free charging.

In exchange, participants agree to charge their electric vehicles during off-peak hours - usually overnight. While the initial pilot has been full, REC is expanding the program to allow an additional 200 member-owners to participate!

Introducing a Smarter MyREC SmartHub


A home energy profile is available for you to fill out. You can then receive emails and alerts customized just for your home.
