'Tis the Season to Save Energy

In the winter, the best way to reduce your energy usage – and lower your electric bill – is to keep the thermostat setting at 68 degrees or lower. At night or when you are away, turn it down a few more degrees, but remember to turn it up only a degree or two at a time to keep costly auxiliary heat from coming on. Consider extra clothing or blankets before

turning up the thermostat. Use LED lights for holiday decorating. If you plan to purchase a new appliance this winter, look for one marked with an ENERGY STAR rating.

When plugging in multiple devices, consider using a smart power strip, which will allow you to turn off all the items at once to save energy.

Make This Winter a Safe One

We plug in an awful lot of new devices over the holidays: festive lights, new kitchen appliances and even outside decorations. Always examine all cords for cracks and frays, and never run cords under rugs or furniture. Take care not to overload extension cords and make sure outlets are rated to meet the

energy demands of the items plugged in. If you use a space heater, keep it at least 3 feet from anything flammable, and make sure it automatically shuts off if it tips over or overheats. Never use an extension cord with a space heater – always plug the appliance directly into an outlet.
