Tips to Save Money and Energy this Winter

- Turn that thermostat down. A setting of 68 degrees or lower for heating is ideal for energy savings.
- Set your programmable thermostat to automatically lower the temperature when you are away or sleeping.
- Have your heating system serviced and performance-tested to ensure it will run properly in the winter.
- Seal and insulate all ducts in unheated places.
- Use space heaters wisely. One heater running 12 hours/day can use over \$70 of electricity.
- Inspect your home for proper insulation and seal air leaks.
- Make sure doors and windows close tightly. Use window film kits to keep out drafts and use caulk and weatherstripping around doors.
- Insulate water pipes in unheated spaces, especially hot water lines.
- If not using your wood stove or fireplace, close the damper to reduce drafts.
- 10 Install an insulating blanket on your water heater if it is located in an unheated space. Set the water heater temperature to 120 degrees.
