You've made space for the tree, started planning Thanksgiving and maybe even created a holiday shopping list. Now it's time to plan for holiday savings on your electric bill.

REC is here to help you! Here's what we recommend:



Use LED lights for all your holiday and general home use. Regular bulbs use about seven times as much electricity as LED lights, and LED lights can last up to 10 times longer.



Set your heat to 68 degrees or

the lowest comfortable setting. You will save about one percent on your heating bill for every eight hours your heat pump runs. Set the thermostat to an even lower temperature when you are not at home or when your family goes to sleep. Want to go a step further? Pick up a programmable thermostat that will let you control the temperature from your smart phone—even when you're not home.



Seal windows and doors. Pick up an easy-to-apply storm window kit. Also consider weather stripping for older windows.



Use space heaters sparingly.

These appliances are big energy hogs. Instead, consider adding an extra layer of clothing or using extra blankets.



Wrap up your water heater. If

your water heater is in a garage, crawl space or other unconditioned area, use a water heater blanket. This will keep the water heater from using more energy during colder months.



Don't forget your crawl

space. Close the foundation vents and seal the crawl space access door with weather-stripping to keep the cold air from entering underneath and ultimately into the conditioned areas of your home.

Enhanced Outage Communications Offered to REC Member-Owners

But when an outage can't be prevented, REC wants to keep you informed at every step. That's why your Cooperative is excited to now offer even better outage text communications in the event that your home or business loses power.

Receive alerts proactively notifying you of power outages and outage restoration. Text messages will notify you when:

- REC is aware of an outage in your area.
- The estimated restoration time is available or changes.
- Crews are en route or on site at the outage location to make repairs and restore your power.
- Power is restored, including the outage cause when available.

With our improved outage communications, members can now report an outage through a text message and can also text key words such as STATUS to get the latest on an outage impacting their home or business.

"This is your Cooperative, and we are always working to improve service for you," said Casey Hollins, Managing Director—Communications and Public Relations.


